What Makes a River, Preparator: This exhibition highlights work from the Kennedy Museum of

Art's collection that visualizes a human ecology, a water-aware vision of the land around us. The work invites reflection on the way people impact rivers and the effect these bodies have on our lives.

Visual Literacy Gallery, Preparator: The objects in this gallery are rotated on an annual basis and have been selected explicitly by Registrar Lisa Quinn and Curator of Education Sally Delgado to stimulate conversations on visual literacy and how we create meaning, both individually and collectively, from visual images. Visitors are invited to slow down, look closely, and consider how they process and interpret visual information. This slowing of visual processing – be it alone or in conversation with others – has the potential to increase our understanding of cultural differences, raise awareness of bias, and encourage empathy. Facilitated Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS) sessions for classes can be scheduled through KMA's education department.

Tower Lounge Gallery, Preparator: The Tower Lounge Gallery features a small selection of objects from the Kennedy Museum of Art's founding collection, gifted by Edwin L. and Ruth E. Kennedy, as well as five weavings purchased by the Museum in the early 2000s as part of the 2005 Weaving is Life exhibition.
